CLARENDON TOWN BOARD Meeting Highlights - October, 2023

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Tracy Chalker submitted a written report; as follows: The Highway Department did grader paving on New Guinea Road, Glidden Road and Howard Road; rebuilt Boots Road and NYS Route 237 Intersection. Multiple roads have been patched and the crew worked with the Town of Barre putting shoulders on in their town. The third roadside mowing is still being done and town properties are being mowed. We've been cleaning the town park; there were three events there this month. Work on routine water maintenance continues and the third quarter water reads have been completed. One grave was dug for a burial at Hillside Cemetery. All trucks have had oil and filter changes and have been greased. The Mack plow truck (402) went to Thru-way Spring for repair of a broken rear spring. The crew pulled bumpers and mounted plow frames to trucks. They're currently working on mounting plows and setting up salters. Clarendon hauled stone for the Village of Holley and cleaned up trees on Jackson and Howard Roads. The highway employees have a lot of vacation left, so chances are we will have small crews working through November.

HISTORIAN REPORT

Historian and Clarendon Historical Society President Melissa Ierlan submitted the following report: The CHS will have a book signing with author Raymond Santoro and his book Haunted Holley on October 18th at 6pm in the chapel at Hillside Cemetery. The Rotary interact club will be in Hillside Cemetery this Sunday to clean headstones again. Doctor Dan Schiavone donated the cleaning solution used for the job this year. I have sent the application for the Christmas Parade which will be on December 8th this year. Scout Troop 62 held an awards ceremony at the CHS this month. All American Diesel Service would like to donate more Christmas lights to the CHS again this year. We are thankful for the donation.

CORRESPONDENCE

Orleans County Self Insurance Plan has sent Notice of an informational meeting Oct. 16, 2023 in Albion. Notice was received from the NYS Department of State Local Government Training Staff of scheduled Land Use Training for Local Officials and Orleans County has sent Notice that FEMA has released preliminary flood insurance rate maps for Orleans County for public comments.

OLD BUSINESS

The Town Board adopted the final town budget for 2024. Regarding Joint Youth, the Commission is trying to get an attorney to look at the changes of funding if a not-for-profit, free of charge.

NEW BUSINESS

Supervisor Moy informed that regarding proposed Water Improvement Benefit Area No. 14, Clarendon has recently been determined to have poverty level income and therefore does not need income surveys completed. The Town needs to take water samples from the homes within the proposed area and have them tested for sanitary quality and will be mailing letters requesting volunteers to have their water tested. Then, the town will go for funding.

The Town Board scheduled a workshop meeting for discussion regarding ARPA funding and intended projects to be held November 21, 2023 prior to the regular meeting; to begin at 6:00 PM. A listing of intended projects must be secured by 2024 and the ARPA monies all spent by 2024.

The contract for Monroe Ambulance will be on the November Town Board agenda.




