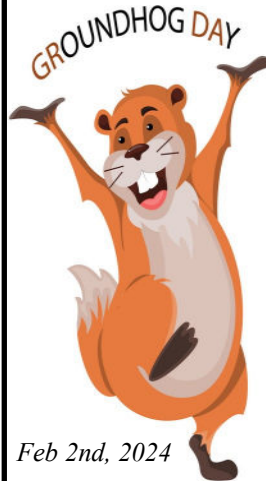

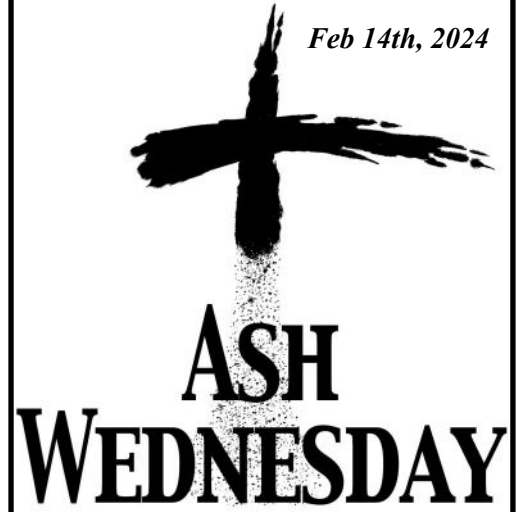

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD

Meeting Highlights - January, 2024

OPEN END

Nicholas VanLogten, Clarendon resident, introduced himself to the Town Board. He is a senior at the Holley High School and is attending the board meeting for school.

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Tracy Chalker reported that the crew has been plowing and salting the roads; within a 16-day period, 19 runs have been made with the trucks. Superintendent reported approximately 450-500 ton of un-used salt ahead of schedule. Multiple trees have been cleaned up from storms as well as deer picked up along roadsides. The fourth quarter water meter readings are complete and regular maintenance and flushing is being done. Running boards have been installed on the new truck; the 402 has eight new tires and there was one burial at Hillside Cemetery. Superintendent Chalker reported that four more stop signs were stolen on Christmas weekend. Anyone with information is asked to contact the Sheriff's Department. Mailboxes on Upper Holley Road were also smashed. The equipment inventory at the highway garage has been done, brush piles cleaned up and Christmas decorations taken down. Superintendent reported getting pricing on a new plow truck. At the end of December, the highway crew was very short staffed due to employees using vacation days left.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman Dave Griggs acknowledged Kevin Johnson's 29 years plus on the Clarendon Planning Board and the Orleans County Planning Board; he's the longest serving member. Mr. Johnson has moved from the Town and has resigned from service to the community. Chairman Griggs submitted the following written report: 12-24-2023 (Regular meeting) - Meeting canceled due to insufficient agenda items. 01-09-2024 (Regular meeting) - SP 07-001, Special permit renewal, Autumn View Apartments, Upper Holley Road. This complex is under new ownership but all existing permit conditions remain the same. Property has been inspected, fee paid and no outstanding complaints. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to grant renewal. SD 23-06 - Pre-Conference for subdivision/Merger, 4909 Upper Holley Road. tax id# 109-1-39, Richard & Wendy Applegate. Revised survey maps showing Lot line corrections have been received. Applicants request for waiver on file. A motion was made, seconded and approved to wave the preconference and proceed to formal application. A motion was made, seconded to approve subdivision subject to merger with existing property, creation of deeds and filing with the County. 2024 appointment recommendations- Planning Board members interviewed and approved appointment recommendations for a full member and for an alternate member to the Planning Board be submitted to the Town Board for their consideration and approval.

HISTORIAN/HISTORICAL SOCIETY REPORT

Supervisor Dick Moy read aloud the following written report submitted by Historian/CHS President Melissa Ierlan: The museum was decorated again for the holidays. All American Diesel helped to decorate again this year. In fact, they donated new led lights for the barn. (around a dozen fixtures) They also bought some new lights for the school house. Kathy Clarke donated two wreaths for

the two benches at the museum. I received a small grant to pay for the restoration of some more historical markers in the county. I am finishing up 4 signs. The signs cost an average of \$50 in materials to strip, prime and re paint. The town historian received a donation of 2 historical books from Orleans County. Connie Gaines donated 3 figurines to the historian to add to the arrowhead she gave a few years ago. They are native American figurines to remember the native Americans who once lived in Clarendon. Roy Bubb made a very generous donation to the historical society in memory of Patricia Gilio. Sally Mathes has donated some items to the town historian. We will begin filling out the schedule for our monthly speakers at the museum. At this time we tentatively have two speakers lined up.

CORRESPONDENCE

The Village of Holley has sent its Highlights Newsletter for the Winter 2023; it's available in the clerk's office for anyone wishing to read it. Notice of adopted legislation has been received; Governor Hochul signed legislation that changes election years for most town and county positions from odd to even years to coincide with national and statewide elections. Clarendon Justice Thomas DiFante has notified/reminded the Supervisor that an audit of the court records must be done annually by the town board; Supervisor Moy will schedule a date with the court clerk. The Town has received payment from the state for snow & Ice 2023/2024 in the amount of \$72,155.09. The Orleans County Chamber of Commerce 2024 legislative luncheon will be held January 26, 2024 from 11:00-2:00 at the White Birch Restaurant in Lyndonville. The Association of Towns annual training school and meeting is in New York City, February 18-21, 2024. The New York State Emergency Management Certification and Training Course – Tier 3 will be offered on January 23, 2024 from 6-9 PM at the Carlton Fire Co. Rec Hall, Oak Orchard Road in Albion in place of the Association of Municipalities Organizational Meeting for 2024 which has been moved to February.

OLD BUSINESS

Supervisor has spoken with our bank representative, NYCLASS and our accountant in regard to having access to town funds if town money is invested. Board members in agreement that monies for future waterline replacement and water tower painting be invested in NYCLASS. Tax revenues would go into the bank for ease of use. Difference in interest is .3%.

NEW BUSINESS

The Town Board accepted with regret, resignation from Planning Board member Kevin Johnson. Dan Cater was appointed to finish Kevin Johnson's term on the Planning Board; to expire 12/31/2025. Jared Scherer was appointed as a Planning Board Alternate Member. The Town Board gave permission to State University of New York Brockport and Orleans County Soil & Water Conservation District for setting up netted traps on town property to monitor spotted lanternfly in Orleans County. Pursuant to Monroe County Water Authority increase in water rates to the town, the Board increased water rates to customers with Monroe County Water Authority as supplier effective 1/1/2024 as follows: water purchased increased To \$4.35/1000 gallons; bulk water purchased increased to \$8/1000 gallons; meter administration fees for bulk water increased to \$35.00 to install and \$35.00 to remove.

Hillside Sketches

Colonel Hubbard Rice

was born on July 28, 1795 in Pompey, Onondaga County, NY. Hubbard moved to Orleans County in 1812 with his parents and settled near Sandy Creek. He helped the surveyor lay out what would become the Village of Holley after the survey of the canal in 1820. Hubbard constructed the first frame building in the village just south of Ridge Road. After the burning of Lewiston during the war of 1812, Hubbard just 18 years of age, enlisted and served through a campaign on the Niagara frontier.

Each man had to furnish his own uniform and pay his own expenses at drills and trainings. Hubbard Rice was the commanding officer of the 25th regiment of artillery.

In 1825 Hubbard moved to the south part of Clarendon and resided there until 1864. There were three houses on Route 237 (Holley Byron Road) that were constructed of stone that was taken from the Stevens farm on the west side of the road. The other was Schubael Lewis' house which served as a stagecoach stop early on.

Hubbard Rice was married three times and had three children. At the time of his death, only one daughter survived him. He was a member of the Holley Presbyterian Church in Holley for years. The Reverend Copeland, former pastor who was from Clarendon and the son of George M. Copeland, conducted the funeral service which was largely attended. A company of soldiers followed the body to Hillside for burial.
