Phases of a Total Solar Eclipse

On **APRIL 8, 2024** just after 3PM, a total solar eclipse will be passing through Western NY to Central NY then the northern part of the Adirondacks exiting the state through Plattsburg. The last total solar eclipse in NYS was in 1925 and the next ones are expected in 2079 and 2144!

The center of the eclipse will pass directly over the Town of Clarendon with totality lasting the longest here. The eclipse is to start around 2:16 PM and end around 4:34 PM with totality occurring from 3:19 - 3:23 PM. Remember to protect your eyes with specialized solar viewing glasses! CLARENDON TOWN BOARD Meeting Highlights - March, 2024

OPEN END

Heather Emmons representing the Holley Community Library, addressed the board with an invitation to the April 26, 2024 Wine Tasting & Farmer's Market fund raiser at the library from 7pm to 9pm. Pamphlets were handed out listing the wineries, farms and businesses scheduled for the event. Tickets will be \$20 each and they go on sale April 1st. All proceeds will go to the library summer program. Ms. Heather will again make the charms for the wine glasses! Ms. Heather reported that the Holley School has denied access to its property for any solar eclipse events on April 8th and left some 'solar glasses' for handing out at the town hall.

HIGHWAY/WATER REPORT

Superintendent Tracy Chalker reported that the crew has been plowing and salting as needed. More downed trees have been cleaned up and Wood Road ditches have been cleared. Dead deer have been cleaned from the roadsides and there was one burial at Hillside Cemetery. Superintendent reported attending meetings and press conferences with government officials and advocacy day for increased monies to maintain roads. Both parties are leaning toward an increase in funds. The parking lot at the Clarendon Fire Company recreation hall was graded and a curb stop replaced at 4535 Holley Byron Road.

Routine water maintenance is being done and three new installs were done in districts 3, 11 and 12.

HISTORIAN/HISTORICAL SOCIETY REPORT

A written report was submitted by Historian Melissa Ierlan: I am waiting to hear if the American Legion will be coordinating the Memorial Day Parade this year. I am also planning on unveiling the new historical marker at the old Holley High School that day. We are hoping to have relatives of the soldiers named on the marker attend the short ceremony. We are in the middle of a huge clean-up effort at the CHS from the many ash trees that are dead and have fallen or lost branches. We are working on a roster of speakers for May through October of this year. Larry Swanger donated a copy of the Enrolled Electors Orleans County from 1934. Ten years have passed and the last names I read from Clarendon are still names we recognize Gaylord, Gaines, Bowen, Kennedy, Applegate, Sparks and Stockham for example. Clean up of the wreaths across America has begun at the cemetery.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR REPORT

Deputy Supervisor Allen Robinson reported that the Orleans County Association of Municipalities meeting for March will be held on the 26th at 6:30 PM at White Birch in Lyndonville. This is the organizational meeting and DA Joe Cardone will be the speaker regarding the proposed District Court. Court Clerk Joanne Major has scheduled a company to shred disposable documents for the town on April 9th. Spectrum has started the town hall upgrade on phone lines.

Superintendent Chalker reported that Spectrum has already done an upgrade at the highway garage which increased the monthly cost and he lost service for a period of time; he's waiting for a credit on the bill because of that.

CORRESPONDENCE

The NYSDEC has sent Notice of Proposed amendments to its Environmental Remediation Programs. National Grid has sent a progress update regarding its Advanced Metering Infrastructure Program. The Orleans County Board of Elections has sent notice of the Presidential Primary Election to be held on April 2, 2024 from 6:00AM to 9:00PM. Congresswoman Tenney has sent a letter regarding 2025 Community Project Funding Process. The Orleans County District Court Committee has updated its proposed plan for the district court in March; a copy is available for review. Deputy Supervisor Robinson urged board members to attend the AOM meeting. The Orleans County Emergency Management Office has sent an email regarding the solar eclipse coming on April 8, 2024 indicating that the center of the eclipse will pass directly over the Town of Clarendon, meaning totality will last the longest here. eclipse is to start around 2:16 and end around 4:34 with totality occurring from 3:19 - 3:23PM. Superintendent Chalker plans to be at the highway garage all day on the 8th; the town hall offices will be closed that day due to possible/probable congestion in town. The County expressed concern that due to the number of people in the area and those trying to live stream the event it may exceed the area cell network capabilities. The County Emergency Management Office will be staffed all day.

OLD BUSINESS

The Town Clerk has come up with a total figure representing the total maintenance fees collected since it was added to the water bills. NYCLASS will be visited when Supervisor Moy returns.


NEW BUSINESS

The Board adopted a Resolution authorizing lateral restrictions within Water Improvement Benefit Area No. 14 and the CEO/OIO has sent a letter regarding water health and safety in WIBA No. 14.







Híllsíde Sketches

Francis Balcom was born in July of 1824 in the town of Murray to parents Abner and Philotheta Balcom. He married Almira Lawrence and their daughter was born in October of 1863. She was born while her

father was enlisted and he was killed a month later. Francis had a sister and two brothers: Lucy Balcom Downs 1831-1925, Thomas Jefferson Balcom 1834-1842 and George Balcom 1836-1848.

In 2016, Civil War re-enactors pay their respects to Corporal Francis Balcom, 151st NY, who was killed at age 39 in the Battle of Mine Run at Locust Grove, Va. On Nov. 27, 1863



FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SPECIMENS OF SOLDIERS' HISTORY. Published March 1867 Balcom, Francis; residence Murray, Orleans County, N. Y.; Corporal One Hundred and Fifty first New York Infantry, Company G; enlisted August 31, 1863, for three years; mustered the same date, as a private; received \$26.50 town bounty, \$75 county bounty; married; father's name Abner; mother's, Philatheta; took part in battle of Mine Run at Locust Grove VA; was killed at this battle, November 27, 1863; remains buried on battle-field.

The family purchased a plot in Hillside Cemetery after it opened in 1863 and when they erected a monument, they had his name inscribed on it along with other members of the family who are buried there.


