

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD Meeting Highlights - May, 2024

The Clarendon Town Board held a workshop meeting on April 29, 2024; Purpose of this workshop meeting is to discuss/review possible projects for remaining ARPA money. General discussion was held and quotes for services were reviewed. Going into the meeting actual ARPA money spent was at \$188,209.10; Total designated unpaid equaled \$82,942.20. Total ARPA allocated to town was \$355,998.93. The Board accepted the following proposals for ARPA projects: Cherry Hill Builders,

Brockport, NY for outside repairs to town hall at an estimate of \$7500 ; Churchville Electric, Inc., Churchville, NY to replace 200-amp service riser for town hall building from pole to building at \$2000. R&M Gutters, LLC, Lyndonville, NY to install seamless gutters and downspouts on town hall building at a cost of \$4200; The Pump Doctor, Inc., Eden, NY, Gasboy diesel pump and fuel management system at the highway Garage at a cost of \$26,133. Supervisor Moy and Deputy Supervisor Robinson were unavailable for the May monthly meeting; Councilman Marc Major ran the meeting.

HIGHWAY/WATER REPORT

Superintendent Tracy Chalker was attending a water conference and not at the meeting. He submitted a written report that was read aloud by Councilman Major; as follows: The crew has mowed town properties including helping out at Hillside Cemetery. There were two youths hired but one was never showing up. We have recently let him go and hired another youth. We also plan on spending some time there this week in preparation for Memorial Day. The first roadside mowing has been started. There was one burial at Hillside Cemetery and a new water tap and push was installed at 4874 South Manning Road. We did an investigation of what appeared to be a water leak on Bennetts Corners Road; turned out to be a buried culvert pipe crossing the road fed by sump pumps. We sleeved the culvert pipe and extended it to the ditch line. We had 191 red tags hung on first notice of non-payment of water bills. Nine tags were hung on shut-off day; after reaching out to people we ended up with two service shut-offs. A fire hydrant was struck and damaged on Holley Byron Road also damaging the stand pipe. We dug that up and made repairs; it was turned into their insurance company. The crew worked with the Town of Albion on a paving project through the work share program. We've finished preparing trucks for summer work and hauled in 360-ton of 5/8 crusher run for shoulder material. A few trees that came down have been cleaned up and the county is also going through with the boom mower and trimming trees and brush back. Heads up to Clarendon Residents: the county is going to be having major projects on South Holley Road and Upper Holley Road this year. Expect delays and detours. The Town will also be starting some projects on New Guinea Road and Merrill Road. We have worked on a few ditching projects. The dirt section of New Guinea Road has been regraded and worked-in; it was sprayed to help with hardening it and locking everything in place. McAllister Drive has also been graded again. We've been working on replacing the missing signs and placed new signs in the Hillside Cemetery telling people to clean up after their dogs. Deer have been picked up from the roadsides and routine water system maintenance continues to be done. The 2023 annual water quality report has been submitted and the F550 truck is in for repairs; a broken spring and ball joints in the front. Superintendent Chalker met with Melissa, a county sheriff's deputy and NYSDEC officer about damage done at the Glidden Road Cemetery.

Acknowledgement and thanks were given to Evan Lusk for helping clean that cemetery prior to the damage done. He has volunteered a lot of time to help keep it nice. Superintendent Chalker requested the board address the planned purchase of the new plow truck. We would currently be two years out if ordered today. Currently there are major hold-backs on heavy frame rails and automatic transmissions; he requested permission to move forward in ordering it. Councilman Major stated that it would be discussed at the June meeting; that the current truck loan will be paid in full April of 2027; that payments on the new truck would not begin until the truck was in our possession. Superintendent Chalker is out of town this week for water classes to maintain his water operator certification licenses; Matt Campbell from Village of Holley has agreed to step in if there are any emergencies. Superintendent Chalker will also be out of town June 2-6, 2024 for the annual Highway School/Conference.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman Dave Griggs submitted the following written report: Planning Board report to the Town of Clarendon - May (Action items only) 04-23-2024 (Regular meeting) - SD 24-01 17195 Ladue Rd. tax id#121.-1-27.2, Anthony Penna subdivision, property merger. The Planning Board clarified issues regarding property ownership, OIO confirmed setting of survey pins. No further issues noted. Applicant requested a waiver from a preconference to a formal. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to move to a formal. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to approve the subdivision/property merger contingent upon creation of deeds and filing with the County. 05-14-2024 (regular meeting) - Meeting canceled ; insufficient agenda items.


SUPERVISOR REPORT - Richard H. Moy, Supervisor

National Grid sent notification of routine tree maintenance on Jackson Road at Clarendon's water transmission line meter pit. Councilman Major reviewed the planned Memorial Day Events in the Village of Holley. The Jewell Buckman American Legion Post 529 will host a memorial service at 9:00 AM in front of the Legion (located under the Holley post office). A new historical marker of the "Holley Boys" who lost their lives in service to their country will be unveiled and dedicated at the old Holley High School. A parade will route south on NYS Route 237 from the old high school and continue to the Hillside Cemetery. Anyone wishing to join in the parade is welcome! Lineup will be in the parking lot behind the library across from the Holley Post Office by 9:30AM. If you have questions, contact Melissa at 585-402-0148.

CORRESPONDENCE

The Orleans County Historian has sent notice that the county will celebrate its 200th anniversary on April 15, 2025. A countywide committee has been formed to plan a yearlong series of events to celebrate this milestone event. Ideas already under discussion include but are not limited to: Committee participation in parades throughout the year; Plant 200 trees; Create a Bicentennial quilt; A Public Art project featuring life-size fiberglass oxen; Schedule a county-wide Museum Open House Day; Harvest a bicentennial maple syrup; Set a new Guinness Book of World Records for the 'largest applesauce". 



Holley Central School District

Holley Central School District officially broke ground to begin renovations for its latest capital project. Photos were taken in the Holley Elementary School small courtyard where its new science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) classroom will be. The project was approved by voters in December 2022 and is expected to be finished by the fall of 2025. The district completed the construction bid process in March of this year. This capital project is led by architects from LaBella Associates and a project management team from Turner Construction. The district is working with the construction management team to ensure that there is as little disruption to students' regular school day experiences as possible. The District is excited to work with the professionals from Turner Construction and LaBella Associates on this project so that the students and staff of Holley continue to have a safe, innovative, and well-maintained learning environment that the entire community will be proud of for years to come," said Holley Superintendent Brian Bartalo. The \$18,100,000 project is fully funded by New York State building aid and the Capital Reserve Fund meaning there is no tax impact to district residents.

The Town Board amended cost approval for Cherry Hill Builders, Brockport, NY for outside repairs to town hall by Motion 2024-153 with an additional \$2850 approved with ARPA Funding; totaling \$10,350 approved for Cherry Hill Builders, town hall repairs. The Board accepted the proposal for a new Honeywell 22 kw automatic standby generator from Frontier Heating & A.C Service, Albion, NY at a cost of \$15,329.66; paid for with ARPA funding. The Board authorized Supervisor Richard Moy to sign the one-year agreement for general financial services as proposed by Municipal Solutions, Inc., 62 Main Street, LeRoy, NY 14482.

2023-24 DEC Announces Deer Harvest Estimates Hunters in New York harvested an estimated 209,781 deer during the 2023-24 hunting seasons, including more older bucks (2.5 years old or older) than ever before. The deer harvest included more than twice as many older bucks than were harvested in the early 1990s, and nearly five times as many than were harvested in 1969 when DEC first began monitoring the age structure of New York's deer herd. This demonstrates the continued effectiveness of DEC's Let Young Bucks Go and Watch Them Grow campaign and the willingness of hunters to voluntarily pass up opportunities at young bucks to improve their future opportunities to harvest older bucks. However, in some areas of the state, especially in Wildlife Management Units (WMUs) 1C, 3M, 3R, 3S, 4J, 6P, 7F, 7H, 7J, 8A, 8C, 8F, 8G, 8H, 8J, 8R, 8S, 9A, and 9F, hunters are not harvesting enough antlerless deer (i.e., adult females and fawns of either sex) to manage deer populations effectively. The 2023-24 antlerless deer harvest was nearly 15% lower than the five-year average. Harvesting antlerless deer helps ensure deer populations remain in balance with available habitat and do not exceed levels of public acceptance that can lead to increased crop damage, deer-vehicle collisions, and other potentially negative deer-related impacts. Harvesting antlerless deer also helps ensure deer are able meet their nutritional demands for antler development, fawn recruitment, and body growth. DEC is evaluating various regulatory and non-regulatory alternatives to increase harvest of antlerless deer during future hunting seasons and encourages all deer hunters in these WMUs to harvest at least one antlerless deer during the upcoming 2024-25 deer hunting season.

Excerpt from Environmental Conservation Police on Patrol Owl Rescue in Suffolk County - On April 19, Environmental Conservation Police Officer (ECO) Perkins responded to a

nursing home in the Town of Smithtown to investigate a report of an injured baby owl sitting on the ground. Officer Perkins arrived at the location and observed the great horned owl struggling to move and maintain its balance. The ECO contacted a local wildlife rehabilitator and secured the owl for transport as nightfall approached. The rehabilitator assessed



the bird's condition upon arrival and determined the owl's leg was swollen, most likely due to falling from a nest in a nearby pine tree. The animal was sent for x-rays and treatment and, once healthy, will be released back into the wild.
