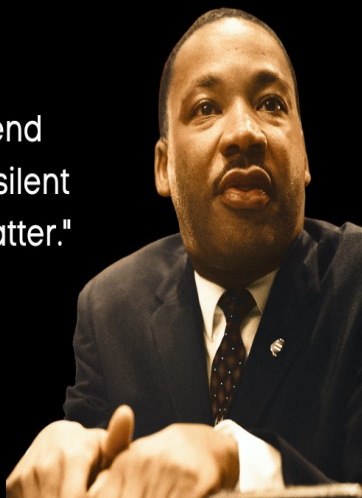

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD

Meeting Highlights - December, 2023

The Town Board held three public hearings in December; for Local Law No. 2 of 2023, Local Law No. 3 of 2023 and for the Comprehensive Plan Update. No one attended the hearings and no comments were submitted. The Board did adopt all three at the regular meeting following said hearings.

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Tracy Chalker reported that the crew has plowed and salted a few times this past month. There have been a lot of ash trees that have been taken care of; the crew has helped the county take down in excess of 75 trees before they fell. Christmas decorations have been put up; the new decorations were shipped too late to use this year. They are at the highway garage. Maintenance on equipment continues. Several deer have been picked up roadside and there have been multiple calls for trees down across the road. The 550 truck is set up for snow plowing. Fourteen red tags for water shut-off were hung. The Village of Holley has had multiple breaks in its water main. Superintendent reported that the flag pole at the highway garage has been fixed and the flag hung; he is working on lighting for the flag. Next month superintendent plans to request consideration for purchase of a new plow truck. It takes 1 ½ years to receive after the order is put in. Cost would be just under \$300,000. It will replace the 2011, 404 Truck. Superintendent reported that in the past the town purchased a new truck every three years to maintain value on the out-going equipment and would like to get back on that schedule. The purchase of a truck every three years will make the truck going out 12-13 years old.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman David Griggs reported that Planning Board member Russell Bosch has completed his required training hours and submitted the following written report: 11-28-2023 (Regular meeting) Meeting canceled due to insufficient agenda items. 12-12-2023 (Regular meeting) SP 19-05, Special use permit renewal, Clarendon Storage, 4510 Hall Road. tax id# 99.-2-37-41. Fee has been paid, Inspected, no outstanding complaints. A motion was made, seconded and approved to grant renewal of Special Use Permit. SP 21-07, Special use permit renewal, Showdowns Ranch, 16213 E. Lee Rd. tax id#98.-1-2. Fee has been paid, Inspected, no outstanding complaints. A motion was made, seconded and approved to grant renewal of Special Use Permit. SP 18-01, Special use permit renewal, Clarendon Corners Storage, 4552 Holley Byron Rd. tax id# 98.13-1.38.1. Fee has been paid, Inspected, no outstanding complaints. A motion was made, seconded and approved to grant renewal of Special Use Permit.

SD 23-06 - Pre-Conference for subdivision/Merger, 4909

Upper Holley Road. tax id# 109.-1-39, Richard & Wendy Applegate. Requested Lot line corrections have not been completed. A motion was made, seconded and approved to table for completion of lot line corrections by surveyor. 2024 appointment recommendations- Planning Board members approved 2024 Planning Board appointment recommendations to be submitted to the Town Board for their consideration and approval. Chairman Griggs to submit to the Town Board at the December meeting.

SUPERVISOR REPORT

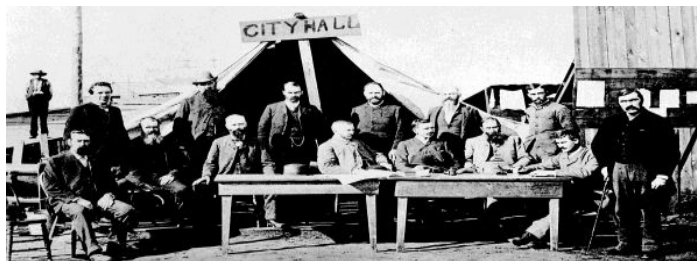
Supervisor Richard Moy thanked Historian Melissa Ierlan for obtaining the grant to have the sign made listing the nine Holley boys lost in the Vietnam war. Melissa was acknowledged for the many things she does for the Clarendon Community. Supervisor reported receipt of the county municipal shelter report with satisfactory findings and a check received in the amount of \$229,691.94 for highway aid/revenue from the state. Orleans Economic Development Agency send a check for \$36.54, being Clarendon's share of the Falls Railroad PILOT program. Assemblyman Hawley sent a copy of his correspondence to Governor Hochul against legislation that would change local elections to be done in even-numbered years.

CORRESPONDENCE

The Town received its mortgage tax distribution revenue for the period of April 1, 2023 through September 30, 2023 in the amount of \$19,456.94.

OLD BUSINESS

The Town Board adopted a Fire Protection & Emergency Services Contract with the Clarendon Fire Co., Inc. for the Years 2024 through 2028. At an emergency meeting held December 22, 2023 the Contract was amended and signed by the Fire Company and Supervisor. The Town Board did adopt the 2023 Comprehensive Plan update document, Local Law No. 2 of 2023 (Senior Citizen Exemptions) and Local Law No. 3 of 2023 (Disabilities Exemptions). Short discussion was held regarding investing town funds with NYCLASS Local Government Investment Pool that pays 5.2% (investments not insured) or at Five Star Bank that pays 4.8% (FDIC) Risk and availability of funds was discussed; Supervisor to confirm coverage of funds; this will be on January 2024 agenda. The Town Board adopted a Resolution urging Governor Hochul to veto legislation that will move local elections to even-numbered years. Patrick White was reappointed to a 5-year term on the Town Planning board and Jim Sheffer was reappointed to a 5-year term on the Town zoning board. Recommended for 3-year term appointments on the County Planning Board were Russ Bosch and Alternate, Bill Fox. The Town Board held its Organizational Meeting on January 2, 2024; annual designations and appointments were authorized.

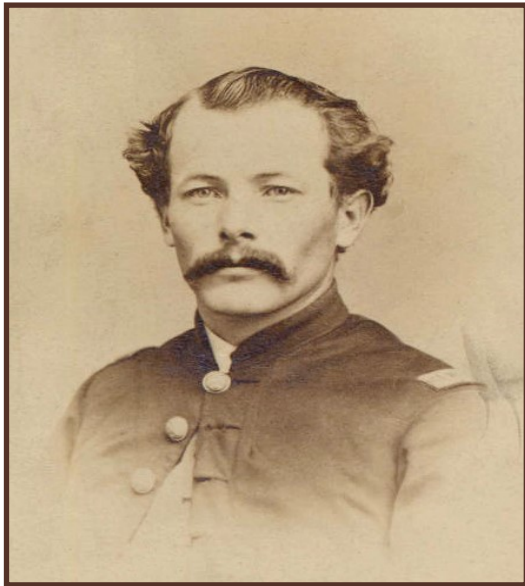

Hillside Sketches

Rev. Benjamin Franklin Miller was born in Murray Feb. 21, 1839. He was from a large family and was educated at the Holley Academy. He then went to the Geneseo Academy and finally graduated from Hamilton College in 1860. Soon after, he enlisted in the 151st Regiment, NY volunteers, in the Civil War. He was a second Lieutenant and made Captain. At the close of the war, he was a brevet, Major.



He studied for the ministry at the Union Theological Seminary in New York and in 1868, was ordained. He married Eva J. Stevens in 1885 and they had one daughter.

At the time of his death, he was the national chaplain of the Union Veteran's, chaplain of the Dwight Post 100, G.A.R. and the chaplain of the Maccabees.
