

CLARENDON TOWN BOARD Meeting Highlights - July, 2025



Scott Mattison of MRB Engineering gave an update on Water Improvement Benefit Area #14 funding; there is no additional funding available right now. MRB is still working on finding grants. Typically if other funding is found from grants, Rural Development will pull back money they've provided. An example was given that if the town received a \$500,000 grant from somewhere, RDA would deduct that amount from the monies they would provide. Because the error was made initially by

MRB in the eligible parcel count, they will make an exception on this in our case. The town is locked in at the 2.37% interest rate; will try for funding in September. MRB is also working on a grant for construction of a new salt shed at the highway garage site

HIGHWAY/WATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

Superintendent Tracy Chalker submitted a written report and reported assisting Albion with paving and Barre with water main installation. Front tires on the mowing tractor have been replaced as have tires on the F350 and F550 trucks. The crew did clean-up of a large tree that came down in the Hillside Cemetery. The field at the Highway Garage has been mowed as have the other town properties. Clean up of multiple trees that came down has been done and multiple deer carcasses have been picked up along the roadside. Elizabeth Drive has been prepared for paving; several intersections were chip-sealed and the crew assisted the Town of Barre with black topping. Over 50 UFPO (utility) stake outs were done. The second quarter water reads are complete. The crew hauled stone for the Village of Holley and attempted a water push at 4888 South Manning Road. There was too much rock at the location so Burrow Brothers was contracted for the job. Routine water maintenance and testing of the water system continues. Lawns have been repaired that were damaged from water service installs and other issues. The highway crew was off for the 4th of July week. The Kubota is in the repair shop for mechanical issues and ditching has been done on Elizabeth Drive.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Chairman Dave Griggs submitted a written report; indicating that the 6/24/25 and 7/8/25 meetings were cancelled due to insufficient agenda items.

SUPERVISOR REPORT

Supervisor Marc Major reported that the Village of Holley and Heron Falls MHP have contracted with Square Engineering Group and are looking into running a four-inch forced sewer main through Clarendon into Holley. This seems to be in the preliminary stages even though the Town Board was just notified on June 24, 2025. In the upcoming months, the board will hold an informational meeting with the engineering group to discuss the design of the system, easements, the possible impacts to existing infrastructure and utilities, the impact on traffic during construction, legal concerns, etc. and any other questions residents may have. A public hearing will be held and finalized with Town Board approval.

The Town has received the Monroe County Water Authority 2024 Annual Report; it is available for review in the Town Clerk's Office. RPM Payroll Company conference called with the Supervisor and bookkeeper on July 9, 2025 to complete the set-up of the new system. It is a more detailed and user-friendly system. Payroll has sent out a uniform mileage sheet to be used for any travel related to town business, during or after hours. This was a recommendation as a result of our audit, to keep us in compliance. Supervisor Major read aloud from the NYMIR Underwriter's report; that after review of the report, the town needs to respond in writing within 60 days indicating recommendations the town will be able to complete or others that will take some additional time. The report information is shared with the NYMIR Underwriting Department. The town's proactive approach to the auditor's recommendations is taken into consideration at our annual renewal. Supervisor Major stated that a comprehensive plan will be created to remedy any deficiencies. Some items have already been completed. The town's insurance agent, the town clerk, highway superintendent and town board members have a copy of the report. Emergency Contact Forms have been distributed to all elected officials and employees to update their personnel files. Workplace Violence Prevention training through NYS Department of Labor should have been sent to everyone's e-mail. This is a requirement every 2 years for businesses with less than 49 employees and a must for all new employees. Please print out the last page that shows your completion of the course and return it to the town clerk for filing.

CORRESPONDENCE

The town has received its certificate of final special franchise full value from NYS Department of Taxation and Finance. NYS Agriculture & Markets has sent its 6/5/2025 municipal shelter inspection report, indicating the shelter is unsatisfactory. The NYS Comptroller has sent a check in the amount of \$244.00 to reimburse revenue from the February 2025 court revenue. The Orleans County Treasurer has sent \$3625.39 in revenue for the second roadside mowing and \$1054.50 for collection of 2025 recycling- waste fees. NYS has sent the final payment for 2024-2025 snow and ice in the amount of \$36,912.34.

OLD BUSINESS

The town is still waiting on a response from the State regarding the speed limit change on Brown Schoolhouse, Upper Holley and Glidden Roads. The town is also waiting for a WIBA #14 funding update and status of the salt shed grant application.

NEW BUSINESS

Discussion was held regarding renewal of the GOGov notification app that was put in place with ARPA funding. Cost to renew the notifications and alerts system for one year (11/1/2025-10/31/2026) would be \$4492.00. Supervisor reported only 80 users since the beginning of this service; that the town website, Gazette and Suburban News contain the information citizens need. Board members passed a motion to let the GOGov app expire without renewal. The Board adopted Resolutions authorizing an updated agreement with Municipal Solutions for General Financial Services and a Municipal Authorization Resolution with Five Star Bank. The board accepted a \$50.00 proposal to purchase the free-standing air conditioner purchased by the town in 2017 that is no longer used.

And the destination that you seek you have arrived at once before?


I believe that bridges do exist that link the present with the past. How do we gain access to them? And how long will they last?

Híllsíde Sketches

Levi Davis was born in New Salem Massachusetts June 9, 1795. Levi enlisted in the service and served during the war of 1812. He

was not in the service for long and returned home and married Lorana Hunt in 1816. Soon after they packed up their belongings on a sled pulled by a team of oxen and started out for Western New York. They traveled to Chataqua County and built a makeshift shanty and began to clear the land. Their first child David was born in this shanty followed by seven daughters. The family then came to Ridgeway, then Medina and finally Murray. It appears that Levi was a stone mason by profession. He was a member of the Universalist Society of Clarendon and South Murray and was one of 50 members in 1834. In 1835, the Universalist Church was built in Clarendon, the first building of any denomination in the town. Seth Knowles and Levi Davis were the stone masons and Philip Preston was the contractor. In 1838 Seth Knowles entered into contract with Eldredge Farwell to build the grist mill. Material was quarried nearby from an abandoned quarry. Levi Davis was one of the masons employed for this job. Levi is also credited with building the Holley Agricultural Works, George Salisbury stone house, a store in Churchville and another in Cortland.

His eight children all lived into adulthood and he had 19 grandchildren. Levi died May 2, 1880 and his beloved wife died October 11, 1881. They both lived long productive lives.



Bird in Focus: Great Egret



The white feathers of the Great Egret (Ardea alba) stand out against the lush green of the marsh habitat it calls home. In mid-summer, you can find this bird hunting for fish, amphibians, reptiles, and even small mammals in shallow water across New York State. In contrast to the more colorful Great Blue Heron or Green Heron, the Great Egret is a snowy white — which can make it challenging to differentiate it between it's relative, the Snowy Egret. For starters, Great Egrets are larger and have longer necks and bills. Snowy Egrets also have yellow feet and a black bill, while Great Egrets have the opposite coloration - black feet and a yellow bill. Another key identifier is that Snowy Egrets have a pronounced plume off their head and neck, making for a unique hairdo. The Great Egret is often found in a colony with other Great Egrets or waterbirds, such as



the Great Blue Heron. The Great Egret nests in trees, woody vegetation, shrubs, or on platforms on islands or above the water. It's found across the world in South America, Asia, Africa, Australia, Europe, and here in New York State. The oldest known Great Egret lived to be 22 years old, and the bird also serves as the ambassador for Audubon.
